Om Mani Padme Hung



The mantra Om Mani Padme Hung is easy to say, yet quite powerful because it contains the essence of the entire teaching. When you say the first syllable Om it is blessed to help you achieve perfection in the practice of generosity. Ma helps perfect the practice of pure ethics, and Ni helps achieve perfection in the practice of tolerance and patience. Pad, the fourth syllable, helps to achieve perfection of perseverance. Me helps achieve perfection in the practice of concentration, and the final sixth syllable Hung helps achieve perfection in the practice of wisdom.

Om Muni Muni Mahamunaye Svaha



By calling the mighty Buddha and his entourage by name, the connection with Buddha's heartmind is stimulated. In future lifetimes, the practitioner will be born wherever the Buddhas are dwelling and become disciples. By constantly receiving blessings, one's mind will be happy; negative forces will have no effect, and the obscurations of negative karma will be purified. In addition, the intellect will be sharpened, awareness increased, and love and compassion will arise. The practitioner will have the ability to greatly benefit sentient beings.

Seeing that the one great need at this time is to supplicate directly the Buddha, Guide of the World, I compiled and translated a concise practice of Buddha Shakyamuni, "The Path of the Sugatas," in order to clear up the evils of this troubled time, and increase the good fortune and merit of beings.
